Abstract

Salt Lake Community College (previously known as Salt Lake Area Vocational School [SLAV] 1948-1959, Salt Lake Trade Technical Institute [SLTTI] 1959-1967, Utah Technical College [UTC] 1967-1987) is a Community College with roots in vocational programs which have expanded over the years to include programs, degrees, certificates, and diplomas in other disciplines. The College History and Events Fonds consists primarily of textual materials, blueprints, audiovisual material, photograph albums, scrapbooks, records, notes, and ephemera related to the history of the College and events sponsored by the College or its organizations.

Historical Sketch of Salt Lake Community College 1948-

Salt Lake Community College began teaching classes September 14, 1948 as the Salt Lake Area Vocational School. A product of the GI Bill, the school evolved out of the War Production Training School established at West High School during the war. After most federal support dried up in 1946, the Salt Lake City School District continued funding the program on its own, which was a burden for the district. The district, with the State Board of Vocational Education, the Salt Lake Chamber of Commerce, the local American Legion, and Veterans of Foreign Wars successfully lobbied the state legislature to create state-supported vocational schools. On March 19, 1947 money was appropriated for establishing vocational schools in all school districts serving populations of at least 140,000.

The Salt Lake City School Board selected long-time vocational teacher Howard Gunderson as the school's first president. The old Troy Laundry Building on 461 South 600 East in Salt Lake City was selected as the school's first building, and equipment was donated from Salt Lake area High Schools which had housed War Production Training Schools during the war. Gunderson received authorization from the Salt Lake City, Park City, and Tooele School districts to teach 39 vocational programs, although teachers could not be found for all of them immediately.

Newspaper ads for the school carried the slogan, "Learn to Earn", which would be used into the 1970s. In its first quarter, tuition for the school was \$78 annually, and 246 students registered in 14 classes. By the following quarter, 948 students were enrolled including 589 veterans.

In 1949 J. Bracken Lee became governor of Utah. A fiscal conservative, he opposed the Area Vocational School as duplicating services available elsewhere. When the legislature presented the 1949–1950 budget with expenses projected to exceed revenues by \$2 million, Lee used line-item vetoes to cut the entire \$500,000 appropriated to the school. Lee's veto drew criticism from The Salt Lake Tribune, labor unions, and veteran's organizations, but the supporters of the cut stood firm, alleging wastefulness at the school. Only by scaling back operations to \$145,000 annually was Gunderson able to keep the school open.

The second President of the school, Jay L. Nelson (1949–1978), referred to the first years of Lee's governorship as "the starvation years". No state funding was provided to the school again until 1951 when it began receiving modest subsidies, and a \$312,000 grant to purchase the Troy Laundry Building it was in.

Initially the school was seen as a central location for high school vocational education, and the school was thus an extension of public secondary education. The school was guided jointly under the direction of the state and local school board until 1959 when it changed its name to Salt Lake Trade Technical Institute, reflecting the more adult-oriented nature of the school. Governance for the school also moved solely into the state's hands under the State Board for Vocational Education.

In 1967 most departments of the school (now renamed Utah Technical College at Salt Lake) moved to the current location at 4600 South Redwood Road in what is now Taylorsville. The state legislature granted money for expansion at the Taylorsville Redwood campus, which is now the primary campus of SLCC. A thriving vocational program existed at the original site well in to the 1980s that served thousands of students seeking basic education and occupational skills.

In 1969 the State unified the scattered public higher education direction into the State Board of Higher Education (later called the Board of Regents). However, the Technical College was not placed entirely under this board. Instead, it was jointly governed by the State Board of Higher Education and the State Board of Vocational Education. Turf wars between the boards erupted almost immediately in 1970 and again in 1974 when the boards fought over who had authority to raise salaries (it was decided that the vocational board controlled wages, but that the higher education board dictated budgets). The Board of Higher Education first sought to convert the schools into community colleges in 1970, which the vocational board outright rejected. The Vocational Board eventually relinquished control of the school in 1978 with an agreement that technical school maintain 75% vocational training, which was state law at the time. President Jay L. Nelson believed this was necessary to prevent the school from becoming merely a feeder for the University of Utah. However, in 1987 the school formally became Salt Lake Community College and the old requirement 75% for vocational training ended.

Scope and Content of the College History and Events Fonds

Salt Lake Community College (previously known as Salt Lake Area Vocational School [SLAV] 1948-1959, Salt Lake Trade Technical Institute [SLTTI] 1959-1967, Utah Technical College [UTC] 1967-1987) is a Community College with roots in vocational programs which have expanded over the years to include programs, degrees, certificates, and diplomas in other disciplines. The collection includes textual, photographic, graphic, and audiovisual materials created by the College, individuals associated with the College, and related entities between 1948 to current day. The College History and Events Fonds is divided into eleven series.

Series 1:

Alumni Association are records created by the Alumni Association at the College and document the Alumni Association activities. Included in this series are 0.91 linear feet of textual materials.

Series 2:

Commencements are records created by the College and document the specific graduation ceremonies at the College. Included in this series are 4.48 linear feet of textual and photographic materials, as well as some ephemera.

Series 3:

Convocations are records created by the College and document the ceremony of gathering which marks the beginning of an academic year. Included in this series are 0.71 linear feet of textual materials and 1.04 linear feet of photographic materials.

Series 4:

Employee Training and Activities are records created by various Offices of the College. Included in this series are 1.79 linear feet of programmatic manuals, training materials, textual materials, audiovisual materials, and other materials related to employee training and development.

Series 5:

Events, College are materials that were created either to promote or record College-sponsored events, such as guest lectures, art shows, or student organization activities. This series contains three subseries:

- **Subseries A: Library Poster Displays** houses the posters which comprised library-sponsored displays. These displays are thematic and were often used more than once.
- **Subseries B: Thayne Center** houses records related to the history of the Thayne Center. Originally founded in 1994 as the Thayne Community Service Center, the center was named for local poet and activist Emma Lou Thayne. The mission of the center is to connect the College community, particularly students, to the larger “community, resources, and programs that cultivate empowerment, leadership, and social change” ([Thayne Center website](#)).

- **Subseries C: 75th Anniversary Celebrations** houses records related to the planning and organizing of the 75th Anniversary celebrations, as well as the events and celebratory materials themselves. The College celebrated seventy-five years in 2023.

Included in this series are 9.71 linear feet of textual materials, graphic materials, and ephemera, as well as 1.08 linear feet of audiovisual materials on CD and videocassette.

Series 6:

Facilities and Campus History are records created by the College as well as affiliated entities and contractors. This series includes 5.21 linear feet of textual materials, development summaries, building projects, blueprints, and publications created by College affiliated individuals. Facilities Requests arranged chronologically. Documentation of College Buildings and Constructions/Expansion Projects arranged by site.

Series 7:

Histories – College, Schools, Programs, Individuals are records and ephemera created by the College which document the history and development of the College. This series includes 11.75 linear feet of textual materials, ephemera, and realia. Objects number approximately 115.

Series 8:

Scrapbooks are records created by entities at the College, such as administration or class governments. These scrapbooks document varying aspects of life at the College from student body government, to dances, to history of the College. This series includes 38.04 linear feet of scrapbooks, which include photographs, news clippings, and ephemera.

Series 9:

Sports, College are records created by the athletic department and sports teams at the College. Intermural and varsity sports were only introduced after the College became a community college in 1987; these records document these types of sports, as opposed to intramural sports, which have always been popular at the College. This series includes 0.25 linear feet of textual and photographic records documenting the sports programs at the College.

Series 10:

Publications About the College are materials published by entities external to the College, but which document the College and its activities. Local news agencies, community members, and associations are represented here in the forms of news clippings, notes, and magazine articles. Included in this series are 0.63 linear feet of textual materials.

Series 11:

Photographic Materials are photographs and slides taken at College events or of College personnel, students, or affiliates. This series includes 19.4 linear feet of photographic prints and slides.
