Step-By-Step Voucher Instructions

- 1. Apply for FAFSA https://studentaid.gov/ or complete the FAFSA student aid estimator form https://studentaid.gov/aid-estimator/
 - -These forms generate your EFC, which is essential to funding your voucher. FAFSA is preferred, as your EFC will be accessible to us without any additional steps.
 - -The FAFSA student aid estimator is not a form that is submitted, it simply estimates your eligibility. If you complete the FAFSA student aid estimator, you must send a screenshot/copy of the results to aguzmans@slcc.eduand/or wendy.blanchard@slcc.edu. We cannot fund a voucher without your EFC.
- 2. Complete the voucher application. This must be done EVERY semester.
- **3.** We need to confirm the number of credit hours you are taking. This is another factor in how much funding you receive. If there are any holds on your account, we cannot confirm this. It is a good idea to be proactive and send a copy of your schedule to Adriana and ensure there are no holds on your account.
- 4. Be sure you provide us with an accurate email address and check your email regularly. Adriana will email if she needs any additional information from you to process your voucher. Vouchers cannot be processed until the last add/drop day of the semester. Check the academic calendar here http://www.slcc.edu/academiccalendar/ to know when that is, it is typically about a month into the semester.
- 5. In summary, we need all the following to fund your voucher
 - Voucher application
 - o EFC
 - Confirmation of enrolled credit hours (schedule).
 - Child care contract
- **6.** Please complete all surveys sent to you. If you fail to complete these surveys, you will not be eligible for CCAMPIS rates (if applicable, SLCC South City campus only) and will have to pay the full cost of your child care and/or repay funds received through the voucher program.
- 7. Again a voucher application must be filled out every semester that you are enrolled in SLCC to receive funding for that semester!
