## THINGS DREAMERS AND ALLIES SHOULD KNOW ABOUT DACA

On Wednesday, July 6, 2022, the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals heard oral arguments for the State of Texas v. the USA. A decision is expected in the coming months that will determine the future of DACA.

Eligible DACA recipients should consider renewing their protections as soon as possible.

At Salt Lake Community College, we are committed to supporting all students, regardless of their immigration status. Here are the top 5 things you should know about DACA:



DACA is valid until your Employment Authorization Document (EAD) or work permit expires.



DACA renewals are encouraged to be submitted 1 year prior to EAD expiration date due to uncertainty around the court decision.



Initial (new) DACA applications are not being accepted.



Advance parole to travel abroad is available to current DACA recipients.



The decision to end DACA does not affect in-state tuition (HB 144) or scholarship eligibility (SB 253) at any public institution in Utah.
