TOTAL COHORT

Beginning the Fall Semester of the 2007 Academic Year, 1,924 first-time full-time students attended Salt Lake Community College, of which 964 were male and 959 were female students. In addition, of the 964 male and 959 female students, there were 698 white males and 675 white females; 107 Hispanic males and 125 Hispanic females; 46 Asian/Pacific Islander males and 54 Asian/Pacific Islander females; 38 black males and 15 black females; 18 American Indian/Alaskan Native males and 11 American Indian/Alaskan Native females, 7 non-resident alien males and 15 nonresident alien females; and 115 students with race/ethnicity unknown, of which 51 were males and 64 were females.

ATHLETIC COHORTS

MALE SPORTS

Baseball

There were a total of 20 first-time full-time students participating in baseball. Of these students, 19 were white and 1 Hispanic. Seventeen were on scholarship related to their participation in the baseball program. Of the 17 receiving aid, 16 were white and 1 was Hispanic. Of the 17 receiving aid, nine white students transferred, one Hispanic student transferred, three white students went on missions, and four white students graduated.

Basketball

There were a total of seven first-time full-time students participating in basketball. Of the seven students, five were white, one was black and one was American Indian. Seven were on scholarships related to their participation in basketball. Of the seven students receiving aid, two white students transferred, one black student transferred, three white students graduated and one American Indian student graduated.

FEMALE SPORTS

Basketball

There were a total of eight first-time full-time students participating in basketball. Of the eight students, six were white, one was black and one was Pacific Islander. Seven of the eight students were on scholarship related to their participation in the basketball program. Of the seven students receiving athletic aid, two white students transferred, three white students graduated, one Pacific Islander student graduated and one black student graduated.

All Other Sports

There were a total of 17 first-time full-time students participating in volleyball and softball. Of the 17 students, 14 were on scholarship related to their participation in the volleyball and softball programs. Of the 14 receiving athletic aid, 10 were white, one was black, one was Pacific Islander, one was Asian and one was Hispanic. Of the 14 students receiving athletic aid, three white students left the program, one Hispanic student left the program, two white students transferred, one Pacific Islander transferred, five white students graduated, one Asian student transferred, and one black student graduated.
