Pook believes every student is capable of success, and she strives to help those in her classes develop knowledge and skills they can use throughout their lives to improve their personal and professional decision-making. She has taught a wide variety of topics at SLCC, including business statistics, financial mathematics, microeconomics,

macroeconomics, and international economics and finance.

Since joining SLCC in 2007, Pook has worked to improve the content and pedagogy of her classes by using student feedback as well as open educational resources to support the college's mission of inclusiveness. A native of Thailand, Pook holds a PhD in economics from the University of Utah, and she has two master's degrees in economics from the University of Utah and Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok.
