

## CHOOSING with PURPOSE

How to avoid WASTING your time and money with concurrent enrollment.

LET'S PRETEND THAT YOU ARE PLANNING TO EARN AN ASSOCIATES DEGREE IN PHYSICS. BELOW YOU WILL FIND A LIST OF THE CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT CLASSES THAT FULFILL REQUIREMENTS FOR THAT DEGREE.

Each of these boxes represent a degree requirement with the list of concurrent enrollment or AP classes that will fulfill that requirement.

#### ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Note: Some categories can be fulfilled with Advanced Placement or AP classes. Be aware, however, that they will only fulfill this requirement if (1) you earn a score on your AP exam that is at least what is indicated in this box and (2) you have those scores transferred to SLCC. Also keep in mind that AP often costs more and takes a year to complete a single class where CE classes usually only take a semester, but if that is the only option you have, go for it!

### **MISSING CLASSES?**

Note: My school offers MATH 1030 and MATH 1050 which fulfill the QL requirement, why aren't those listed here? Because for this specific degree the only classes that will fulfill the QL are the ones listed here. If you take MATH 1030 or 1050 it will just sit on your college transcript as useless elective credit unless you choose a different major.

### **CREDITS REQUIRED**

Note: You'll notice that only three credits are required to fulfill this requirement. This means that you only need to take one class from this category to fulfill the requirement. If you take more than that, it will just sit on your college transcript as extra elective credit that doesn't apply toward your degree and as a result won't save you any time toward completion. If you want to explore more classes in that subject area, consider taking high school classes so you don't have useless college credit hanging over you.

### **ON-CAMPUS CE**

**Note:** The OC icon indicates that this class is only available through the Concurrent On-Campus Program and not in the high schools.

#### O CREDITS?

Note: If a category list 0.0 credits required that means that either this category is satisfied through pre-major coursework or it could mean that this degree requires a very specific course to fullfill this requirement that is not offered through concurrent enrollment or AP. In other words, you don't need to worry about this requirement until after you graduate from high school, or you can pay regular SLCC tuition and take it as an Early Enrollment student.

### **PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS**

Note: These are required courses and elective courses that are specific to this degree that are offered through concurrent enrollment. There are a lot more classes and credits you will need to complete within this category, but they can only be taken after high school graduation or through Early Enrollment.

# NOW IT'S TIME TO BUILD YOUR PERSONALIZED DEGREE PLAN IN MYCE!

BEFORE YOU START TAKING CLASSES THAT MIGHT NOT HELP YOU.

STEP 1: Before you can build your plan you need to be admitted to SLCC so that you can set up a MySLCC account. To get admitted go to https://slcc.edu/concurrentenrollment/Students/admission.html.
