### Apprenticeship Electrical CC — 24 Credits — Licensure Information

#### UPDATED: 07/15/2024

The <u>SLCC Apprenticeship Electrical CC – 24 Credits</u> – program is designed to provide classroom-related and supplemental instruction for an apprenticeship program and is designed to prepare students to apply for professional licensure through the <u>Utah Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing (DOPL)</u>. SLCC neither provides on-the-job training nor acts as a sponsor for apprentices. Individuals must locate their own sponsors. To be eligible for Journeyman Electrician licensure in Utah, an apprentice must complete 576 minimum hours of related instruction and four years and 8,000 hours of on-the-job training (OJT). The SLCC Apprenticeship Electrical CC program is registered with the US Department of Labor.

This document represents a good faith effort to describe licensure requirements in other states. Please recognize that there may be additional requirements for licensure not outlined in this document. Licensure and employment requirements may vary by state, agency, and organization. In additional to the requirements listed below, applicants may be asked to complete state-specific apprenticeship programs, submit criminal background checks, provide documentation of US citizenship or work authorization, pay licensure fees or other certification fees, abide by codes of conduct, or other requirements not outlined in this document. This document does not describe *city or county* licensure requirements (other than New York City). We recommend that students who are planning to move out of Utah research licensure requirements in other states.

- <u>Electrical Journeyman Requirements</u>: Alaska requires a minimum of 8,000 hours work experience subject to the National Electrical Code. A minimum of 6,000 hours must be commercial/industrial. A maximum of 2,000 hours may be residential. A maximum of 1,000 hours of trade-related classroom training and/or 1,000 hours of power lineman experience may be part of the 8,000 hours requirement. No maintenance hours will be accepted.
- <u>Electrical Residential</u>: Requires a minimum of 4,000 hours of work in the trade. Up to 500 hours of trade-related classroom training can be substituted for 500 hours of the 4,000 hour requirement. This license allows the holder to act as a journeyman on residential sites only. The holder will be considered a trainee level electrician on commercial sites. No maintenance hours will be accepted.
