# School of Health Sciences Occupational Therapy Assistant – Associate of Applied Science Admission Criteria for Fall 2025



Applicants are selected on a merit based/competitive admission process. Application does not guarantee admission. See the <u>Health Sciences</u> <u>Admissions website</u> for current application information. Review <u>this video</u> for an overview of the OTA Program.

# SLCC ADMISSION PROCESS

- 1. <u>Apply to SLCC</u> as a degree seeking student & declare Health Sciences as your Area of Study, & Occupational Therapy Assistant as the Program of Study. Due to the selective admission process, you will be declared as a Pre-Medical Health Sciences-AS student.
- 2. Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required upon application to the program.
- 3. For transfer credit, complete all the required steps in the <u>SLCC Transfer Evaluation process</u>. Be sure to submit transcripts for ALL colleges and universities where prerequisite coursework has been completed. *This process may take 4-6 weeks and must be completed before a student's application will be considered*.
- 4. Complete SLCC Placement Process or submit current SAT/ACT test scores if MATH and ENGL course work have not been transferred to SLCC.
- 5. Schedule an appointment with the <u>OTA Academic Advisor online</u> or call 801-957-6215. Students are encouraged to meet regularly with the OTA advisor.
- 6. ALL communication will be through BruinMail.

### OTA PROGRAM ADMISSION PROCESS

All support documentation must be uploaded to the application portal at the time of applying. **Applicants will not be able to make changes to** their application or upload documents after application is submitted. The Health Sciences Admissions Office will not accept documents via email.

# 1. Prerequisite Courses

The OTA program recommends taking HS 1100 (Formerly MA 1100) Medical Terminology prior to applying to the OTA program, but it is not required and will not affect admission to the program.

# 2. Verification of High School Graduation

Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required. Documentation may include a transcript, diploma, or a letter of explanation of why documentation cannot be provided.

# 3. Admissions Interviews

<u>Multiple Mini-Interviews</u> (MMI's) will be conducted for top-ranking applicants after the admissions session has closed. Notifications will go out to those eligible to be interviewed within 10 days of the admissions session closing. Please see the current OTA <u>Selective Admissions</u> <u>Requirements</u> page for the most up to date information.

# 4. Preferred But Not Required (Receive extra consideration in the application process)

- a. Prior Degree-Prior Associate's and/or Bachelor's degree will obtain additional consideration. Degree(s) must be posted on official college transcript.
- b. Completion of an Area Health Education Center (AHEC) program
- c. Completion of a MA or CNA certification within the last 5 years-must submit certification.
- d. Veteran Status-Veterans verified through the Veterans Services office will receive additional consideration in their admissions process.
- e. Community Engagement- Applicants that have demonstrated a willingness to serve others through volunteer community engagement will receive additional consideration on their application. Community engagement can be volunteering at food banks, homeless shelters, emergency assistance programs, neighborhood cleanup programs, etc.

Community Engagement Criteria:

- Engagement should have occurred within the last five years and since high school graduation
- Must be performed within the state of Utah
- Continual experiences encouraged
- Must be served without payment or reward
- Service engagement with underserved groups or populations is encouraged
- Only one experience will be considered for the application

Students must submit a letter of recommendation from the mentor that supervised community engagement. The letter should discuss type of service, length of time committed to serving and where service was performed. Documentation must be submitted via application portal at time of application.

# 5. Apply Online

Log-in to "MySLCC">Click on "Discover" (Found on the top left under the 3 horizontal lines next to the SLCC logo) >Type in and click on "Selective Admissions Forms"> Click on "Start Here" under Health Sciences Programs if you're a first-time applicant > Click on "here" under apply to open admissions sessions if you've already registered for the Health Sciences Admissions Portal> Choose Occupational Therapy Assistant in the application. Online application will only appear on the menu during open application periods.

There is a non-refundable application fee of \$25. The OTA online application will only appear on the menu during open application periods.

24 students are accepted into the program every fall semester. This program requires full time day attendance.

# Veterans verified through the <u>VA office</u> will be given additional consideration in the application process.

### AFTER PROGRAM ACCEPTANCE

Acceptance into the program will be given on a "Conditional" basis. Students must complete the following within the allotted time in their "Conditional Acceptance" letter (about 30 days) to receive "Full Acceptance". If students don't complete these requirements, they will forfeit their spot. Once "Full Acceptance" is granted, students will be given registration & orientation information.

 American DataBank Complio: Students are required to create an American DataBank Complio account to order their background check, submit necessary documentation, and meet immunization compliance requirements. Create an account by going to: <u>https://saltlakecc.complio.com/</u>

- 2. Immunizations: Order "Immunization Compliance Package" from American DataBank Complio, \$15.
  - a. If accepted into the program, this subscription will need to be renewed every 12 months while in the program for \$15.
  - b. For specific information, please see the "After You're Accepted Into The Program" section under the desired program on the <u>Health</u> <u>Sciences Admissions website</u>.
  - c. Immunization requirements are subject to change, therefore check the website often and far enough in advance to be able to accommodate deadlines. For questions on immunizations, please contact 801-957-6253 or <u>healthsciencesadmissions@slcc.edu</u>.
  - d. Required immunizations officially documented and uploaded into American DataBank Complio:
    - i. Annual Influenza Vaccination
    - ii. Annual Tuberculosis (see HS website)
    - iii. Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis (Tdap)
    - iv. Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
    - v. Varicella (Chicken Pox)
    - vi. Hepatitis B (Series and titer may take up to 1 year, so start well in advance)
    - vii. Hepatitis A vaccination series (highly recommended but not required)
    - viii. COVID-19

\*Note: Student applying for the August date should have their Hep B titer & MMR verification uploaded into Complio by the August application deadline.

- 3. Background Check: Order "Criminal Background Check Package" through American Databank Complio, \$29
  - Students assume the risk if their criminal background check is not clear. If students do not pass the background check, they may
    not be accepted into the program. This may result in withdrawal from the program after the tuition refund deadline has passed.
    The clinical site will make the final determination about accepting students for clinical placement.
  - b. It is **strongly** recommended that prospective students take measures to have criminal offenses <u>expunged</u> or sealed from their record if possible. Students can review <u>Criminal History Guidelines on DOPL's website</u>. Students are advised to contact the <u>Health</u> <u>Sciences Admissions Coordinator</u> with any questions or concerns prior to applying to the program.
- 4. Drug Screening: Order "Drug Screening Package" through American DataBank Complio, \$35
  - a. You will have 48 hours to complete the test once ordered.
- 5. CPR Certification: Documentation uploaded into American DataBank Complio account
  - a. Current <u>American Heart Association</u> OR <u>American Red Cross</u> 2-year BLS Healthcare Provider certification. BLS (CPR) Certification may be obtained at any certified provider. **Students will need to ensure their BLS (CPR) certification is current throughout the program.**

#### **Program Hours & Minimum Grades**

Classes are taught weekdays generally between 7:30am and 5:00 pm and may be in block schedules. Some courses are web enhanced. Program is an engaged department and service learning is expected in most courses requiring an additional 10-15 hours per course. Clinic assignments are required and scheduled outside of class requiring additional time commitment in the late afternoon. There is one fieldwork placement in each of the first three semesters for 30 hours each. Level II fieldwork is 40 hours per week for 16 weeks during fourth semester.

To maintain a position in the OTA program, students must maintain a **C grade or better** in each required class. While in the program, students may be required to attend fieldwork, conferences, and out-of-state activities. Expenses for these activities are additional student costs.

#### **National Certification Examination**

OTA graduates will be prepared to take the national certification examination administered by the **National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy, Inc. (NBCOT)** after successful completion of the program. Students will then be a COTA (Certified Occupational Therapy Assistant) and be eligible for state licensure which is required to practice in Utah. ### **Program Accreditation & Licensing**

This program is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE) 4720 Montgomery Lane, Suite 200, Bethesda, MD 20814-3449, (301) 652-2682, (301) 652-1417-Fax, accred@aota.org. Graduates will be prepared to take the national certification examination administered by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy, Inc. (NBCOT). After successful completion of the exam, the individual will be a certified occupational therapy assistant (COTA) and eligible for state licensure, which is required to practice in Utah.
