# School of Health Sciences Occupational Therapy Assistant – Associate of Applied Science Admission Criteria for Fall 2026



Applicants are selected on a merit based/competitive admission process. Application does not guarantee admission. See the Health Sciences Admissions website for current application information.

#### **SLCC ADMISSION PROCESS**

- 1. Apply to SLCC as a degree seeking student & declare Health Sciences as your Area of Study, & Occupational Therapy Assistant as the Program of Study. Due to the selective admission process, you will be declared as a Pre-Health Sciences-AS student.
- Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required upon application to the program.
- For transfer credit, complete all the required steps in the SLCC Transfer Evaluation process. Be sure to submit transcripts for ALL colleges and universities where prerequisite coursework has been completed. This process may take 4-6 weeks and must be completed before a student's application will be considered.
- 4. Complete SLCC Placement Process or submit current SAT/ACT test scores if MATH and ENGL course work have not been transferred to SLCC.

#### **OTA PROGRAM ADMISSION PROCESS**

All support documentation must be uploaded to the application portal at the time of applying. Applicants will not be able to make changes to their application or upload documents after application is submitted. The Health Sciences Admissions Office will not accept documents via email.

## 1. Prerequisite Courses

## **Verification of High School Graduation**

Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required. Documentation may include a transcript, diploma, or a letter of explanation of why documentation cannot be provided.

## 3. Situational Judgement Test

All applicants must complete a proctored, 30-question assessment **PRIOR** to applying for admission. Applicants will schedule a testing time with any SLCC Testing Center to complete the assessment via Canvas. Applicants are allowed to take the SJT only once per admissions cycle. Any additional attempts to take the SJT will not be allowed and will disqualify an application for consideration. Learn more by clicking here: SLCC Health Sciences Linktree

#### 4. Preferred But Not Required (Receive extra consideration in the application process)

- a. Prior Degree-Prior Associate's and/or Bachelor's degree will obtain additional consideration. Degree(s) must be posted on official college transcript.
- b. Completion of a MA or CNA certification or graduation from an <u>Area Health Education Center (AHEC) program</u> within the last 5 years-must submit certification.
- c. Community Engagement- Applicants that have demonstrated a willingness to serve others through volunteer community engagement will receive additional consideration on their application. Community engagement can be volunteering at food banks, homeless shelters, emergency assistance programs, neighborhood cleanup programs, etc.

Community Engagement Criteria:

- Engagement should have occurred within the last five years and since high school graduation
- Must be performed within the state of Utah
- Continual experiences encouraged
- Must be served without payment or reward
- Service engagement with underserved groups or populations is encouraged
- Only one experience will be considered for the application

Students must submit a letter of recommendation from the mentor that supervised community engagement. The letter must discuss type of service, length of time committed to serving and where service was performed. Documentation must be submitted via application portal at time of application.

d. Veteran Status-Veterans verified through the Veterans Services office will receive additional consideration in their admissions process.

#### 5. Apply Online

Log-in to "MySLCC">Click on "View All Cards" (Found on the right hand side) >Type in and click on "Selective Admissions Forms"> Click on "Start Here" under Health Sciences Programs if you're a first-time applicant. Click on "here" under "apply to open admissions sessions" if you've already registered for the Health Sciences Admissions Portal. Choose Occupational Therapy Assistant in the application. Online application will only appear on the menu during open application periods.

There is a non-refundable application fee of \$40. The OTA online application will only appear on the menu during open application periods. **24** students are accepted into the program every fall semester. This program requires full time day attendance.

#### AFTER PROGRAM ACCEPTANCE

Acceptance into the program will be given on a "Conditional" basis. Students must complete the following within the allotted time in their "Conditional Acceptance" letter (about 30 days) to receive "Full Acceptance". If students don't complete these requirements, they will forfeit their spot. Once "Full Acceptance" is granted, students will be given registration & orientation information.

- 2. Immunizations: Order "Immunization Compliance Package" from American DataBank Complio, fees apply.
  - a. If accepted into the program, this subscription will need to be renewed every 12 months while in the program, fees apply.
  - b. For specific information, please see the "After You're Accepted Into The Program" section under the desired program on the <u>Health</u> Sciences Admissions website.
  - c. Immunization requirements are subject to change, therefore check the website often and far enough in advance to be able to accommodate deadlines. For questions on immunizations, please contact 801-957-6253 or healthsciencesadmissions@slcc.edu.
  - d. Required immunizations officially documented and uploaded into American DataBank Complio:
    - i. Annual Influenza Vaccination
    - ii. Annual Tuberculosis Blood Test (see HS website)
    - iii. Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis (Tdap)
    - iv. Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
    - v. Varicella (Chicken Pox)
    - vi. Hepatitis B (Series and titer may take several months, so start well in advance)
    - vii. Hepatitis A vaccination series (highly recommended but not required)
    - viii. COVID-19

- 3. Background Check: Order "Criminal Background Check Package" through American Databank Complio, fees apply.
  - a. Students assume the risk if their criminal background check is not clear. If students do not pass the background check, they may not be accepted into the program. This may result in withdrawal from the program after the tuition refund deadline has passed. The clinical site will make the final determination about accepting students for clinical placement.
  - b. It is **strongly** recommended that prospective students take measures to have criminal offenses <u>expunged</u> or sealed from their record if possible. Students can review <u>Criminal History Guidelines on DOPL's website</u>. Students are advised to contact the <u>Health Sciences Admissions Coordinator</u> with any questions or concerns prior to applying to the program.
- 4. **Drug Screening**: Order "Drug Screening Package" through American DataBank Complio, fees apply.
  - a. You will have 48 hours to complete the test once ordered.
- 5. CPR Certification: Documentation uploaded into American DataBank Complio account
  - a. Current <u>American Heart Association</u> OR <u>American Red Cross</u> 2-year BLS Healthcare Provider certification. BLS (CPR) Certification may be obtained at any certified provider. Students will need to ensure their BLS (CPR) certification is current throughout the program.

<sup>\*</sup>Note: Student applying for the August date should have their Hep B titer & MMR verification uploaded into Complio by the August application deadline.

#### **Program Hours & Minimum Grades**

Classes are taught weekdays generally between 7:30am and 5:00 pm and may be in block schedules. Some courses are web enhanced. Program is an engaged department and service learning is expected in most courses requiring an additional 10-15 hours per course. Clinic assignments are required and scheduled outside of class requiring additional time commitment in the late afternoon. There is one fieldwork placement in each of the first three semesters for 30 hours each. Level II fieldwork is 40 hours per week for 16 weeks during fourth semester.

To maintain a position in the OTA program, students must maintain a **C** grade or better in each required class. While in the program, students may be required to attend fieldwork, conferences, and out-of-state activities. Expenses for these activities are additional student costs.

## **National Certification Examination**

OTA graduates will be prepared to take the national certification examination administered by the **National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy, Inc. (NBCOT)** after successful completion of the program. Students will then be a COTA (Certified Occupational Therapy Assistant) and be eligible for state licensure which is required to practice in Utah. ## **Program Accreditation & Licensing**

Graduates will be prepared to take the national certification examination administered by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy, Inc. (NBCOT). After successful completion of the exam, the individual will be a certified occupational therapy assistant (COTA) and eligible for state licensure, which is required to practice in Utah.
