TOTAL COHORT

Beginning the Fall Semester of the 2010 Academic Year, 2,161 first-time, full-time students attended Salt Lake Community College, of which 1,043 were male and 1,118 were female students. These 2,161 students identified themselves as the following race/ethnicity:

- White: 737 males and 760 females
- Hispanic: 115 males and 139 females
- Black: 35 males and 35 females
- Asian: 40 males 45 females
- Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander: 18 males and 29 females
- American Indian/Alaskan Native: 17 males and 19 females
- Nonresident Alien: 13 males and 7 females
- Two or more races: 7 males and 6 females
- Race/Ethnicity Unknown: 61 males and 78 females

ATHLETIC COHORTS

MALE SPORTS

Baseball

There were a total of 14 first-time, full-time students participating in baseball. Of these students, 10 were white, 3 were Hispanic, and 1 was Asian. Eleven were on scholarship related to their participation in the baseball program. Of the 11 receiving aid, 7 were white, 3 were Hispanic, and 1 was Asian. Of the 11 receiving aid, 1 white student left the program, and 6 white students, 3 Hispanic students, and 1 Asian student graduated.

Basketball

There were a total of 11 first-time, full-time students participating in basketball. Of these students, 3 were white, 5 were African-American, and 3 were Non-resident Alien. Eleven were on scholarship related to their participation in the basketball program. Of the 11 receiving aid, 3 were white, 5 were African-American, and 3 were Non-resident Alien. Of the 11 receiving aid, 1 white student, 1 African-American student, and 3 Non-resident Alien students transferred, 2 African-American students left the program, and 2 African-American and 2 white students graduated.

FEMALE SPORTS

Basketball

There were a total of 6 first-time, full-time students participating in basketball. Of these students, 4 were white, and 2 were Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander. Six were on scholarship related to their participation in the basketball program. Of the 6 receiving aid, 1 white student transferred, 1 white student went on a mission, and 1 Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander left school. Two white students and 1 Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander graduated.

All Other Sports

There were a total of 20 first-time, full-time students participating in volleyball and softball. Of the 20 students, 14 were white, 3 were Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, 2 were Non-resident Alien, and 1 was American Indian/Alaska Native. Eighteen of the students were on scholarship related to their participation in volleyball and softball. Of the 18 receiving aid, 12 were white, 3 were Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, 2 were Non-resident Alien, and 1 was American Indian/Alaska Native. Of the 18 receiving aid, 1 Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander student transferred, 2 white students and 2 Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islanders left the program, and 10 white students, 2 Non-resident Alien students, 2 Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islanders, and 1 American Indian/Alaska Native graduated.
