

2015-2016 ATHLETIC STUDENT RIGHT TO KNOW

TOTAL COHORT

Beginning the Fall Semester of the Academic Year, 1,335 first-time, full-time students attended Salt Lake Community College, of which 713 were male and 622 were female students. These 1,335 students identified themselves as the following race/ethnicity:

- White: 462 males and 360 females
- Hispanic: 120 males and 125 females
- Black: 21 males and 19 females
- Asian: 26 males 30 females
- Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander: 19 males and 20 females
- American Indian/Alaskan Native: 10 males and 12 females
- Nonresident Alien: 22 males and 13 females
- Two or more races: 19 males and 29 females
- Race/Ethnicity Unknown: 14 males and 14 females

ATHLETIC COHORTS

MALE SPORTS

Baseball

There were a total of 14 first-time, full-time students participating in baseball. Of these students, 11 were white, 1 was Hispanic, 1 was half Hispanic and half African American and 1 was African American. 11 were on scholarship related to their participation in the baseball program. Of those receiving aid, 2 white students left the program. 1 Hispanic and 1 Hispanic/African American transferred and 1 African American left for a church related mission and graduated upon his return and completion. 6 white students graduated.

Basketball

There were a total of 10 first-time, full-time students participating in basketball. Of these students, 4 were white, 4 were African-American, 1 was Asian (India) American, and 1 was African Canadian. Ten were on scholarship related to their participation in the basketball program. Of the 10 receiving aid, 4 were white, 4 were African-American, 1 was Asian (India) American and 1 was African Canadian. Of the 10 receiving aid, 2 African-American students transferred, 1 African-American student left the program and later graduated from SLCC, 1 African Canadian student left the program. 1 African-American, 4 white students and 1 Asian (India) American Student graduated.

FEMALE SPORTS

Basketball

There were a total of 10 first-time, full-time students participating in basketball. Of these students, 7 were white, and 3 were African American. 9 were on scholarship related to their participation in the basketball program. Of the 9 receiving aid, 1 white student transferred, 1 white student left school for a church related mission. 5 white students and 2 African American students graduated.

All Other Sports

There were a total of 17 first-time, full-time students participating in volleyball and softball. Of the 17 students, 15 were white, 1 was Latina, and 1 was Native-American. 16 of the students were on scholarship related to their participation in volleyball and softball. Of the 16 receiving aid, 14 were white, 1 was Latina, and 1 was Native-American. Of the 16 receiving aid, 1 Native-American student transferred, 1 Latina transferred, 6 white students transferred and 8 white students graduated.
