# BLACK HISTORY MONTH


Black History Month has come back around this year and we are thrilled for what the ODMA staff and Black Student Union have planned.


# WHAT DOES DIVERSITY AND THE ODMA MEAN TO YOU?

# What to Think About

There may be some changes in the Office of Diversity and Multicultural Affairs. This specifically pertaining to the name of the ODMA. Recently in politics, there's a new bill being signed off by Governor Cox. HB 261, also known as the Equal Opportunity Initiative. It has grown with great interest and controversy among many people.

Most of the values that the ODMA stands on, coordinator roles, etc. Don't align with the items stated in the bill.

It's a big question of equality vs equity. There's the argument that we are putting an already historically marginalized community in jeopardy by removing the opportunities and spaces available to these communities.

Diversity: The practice or quality of including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientation, etc.

Oxford Dictionary

The bill prohibits engaging, maintaining, policy, procedure, practice, program, office, initiative, or required training that; is referred to or named diversity, equity, and inclusion.

The ODMA being called the Office of Diversity and Multicultural is in the process of choosing a new name. Hopefully to encompass the values and community that ODMA stands for, and has stood for, to so many students.

There is uncertainty as to how the bill will affect the students and their success in graduation, as we remove the focused spaces dedicated to these students that identify in these communities.

"There's a sense of community to many students in these places, it brings different people together and allows us to understand where people of similar backgrounds are coming from. It's being able to see how we can support and give back to the community that we were both raised in, identify with and are apart of."
