Final Exam and Final Grades

- Students scoring less than 50% on the final exam for developmental-level math courses cannot get a final grade higher than a C-.
- Students scoring less than 60% on the final exam cannot get a final grade higher than a D.

Tips for the Final Exam

- Work each multiple-choice problem before looking at the answer options. Be careful to select the option that matches your answer.
- Work on all of the problems on the test and show all of your work. Work each multiplechoice problem before looking at the answer options. Be careful to select the option that matches your answer.
- Work on all of the problems on the test and show all of your work on the open response questions.
- Memorize the slope formula, point-slope formula and the slope-intercept form of an equation.
- Pay close attention as to whether a line should be solid or dashed when drawing your lines for linear inequalities.
- Be sure to remember the shading when graphing linear inequalities.
- Pay close attention to the negative signs in problems.
- Be sure to multiply all terms by the lowest common denominator (LCD) when clearing the fractions in an equation.
- If the problem asks you to solve, graph, and give interval notation; be sure to solve it, graph it, and give interval notation. Sometimes students forget to do the interval notation.

- When asked to solve a system by substitution, be sure to use the substitution method.
- When asked to solve a system by elimination, be sure to use the elimination method.
- Please remember the answer to a system is usually an ordered pair. Sometimes students solve for one variable and then forget to solve for the second variable in the ordered pair.
