



STUDENT FEE INFORMATION

What Are Student Fees?

Student fees are charges that all students pay when they register for classes. These fees help fund programs, services, and facilities that enhance your college experience—things like student activities, campus events, leadership opportunities, and more. (Note: This is not the same as tuition or course-specific fees.)

Who Decides How Student Fees Are Used?

Every fall, SLCC forms a Student Fee Board made up of students and staff. New members are trained to understand their role in reviewing and recommending how student fee money is spent.

In January, the Board holds Student Fee Hearings. The department presentations are public meetings where areas that receive (or want to receive) student fee funding present:

- How they've used their funding
- Requests for continued or increased funding
- How their services benefit students

Specific times and locations of the hearings are advertised in SLCC Today in December and early January. After the hearings, the Board—led by the Student Body President and the VP for Student Affairs—discusses and votes on funding recommendations. The proposal then goes through several levels of approval:

1. SLCC President
2. SLCC Board of Trustees
3. Utah State Board of Higher Education (final approval)

In early March of each year (after final approval) a Truth in Tuition forum is held where results of the Fee Board's decisions and proposed tuition changes are presented. The specific time and location will be advertised in SLCC Today.

Fee Description	
Arts & Cultural Events	Fee shall be used to fund student programming and events focused on arts and culture.
Athletics	Fee shall be used to pay the expenses incurred for the personnel and operations for the collegiate athletic programs at SLCC.
Building Bond	Fee shall be used to keep our student centers safe, welcoming, and sustainable for the future by paying for past construction, future renovations and ongoing repairs.
Child Care	Fee shall be used to offset the cost of child care through a voucher program for income-eligible students.
Student Centers	Fee shall be used to pay the expenses incurred for the personnel, operations and maintenance for the Student Centers at Taylorsville and Jordan campuses, and event support at South City campus.
Student Engagement	Fee shall be used to fund the personnel and operations of student leadership programs (SLCCSA, clubs, events, leadership training, student forums), community engagement programming and basic needs support for students.
